- Create three questions you would like to ask either a character in the text or the writer **and explain** why you would want to know the answers. Identify the chapter/page, character/writer, and questions you would ask in your reader response.

or

- Imagine if you were one of the characters in the novel. If it were you, how would you react or what would you do in one of the major circumstances described in the book? Identify the chapter and what's happening.

A well-thought out, well-explained response to one of these should probably be close to a page in length.
