If you submit work late, you may have to wait an extended period before it will be marked. You will have a 0 in Powerschool until such time that I have time to mark your late work. The moral of the story: **Get all work in on time!**
4. If you miss a class for ANY reason, **it is your responsibility to catch up on missed work.** Most work will be posted on my website for you to check. Do not show up to class and expect me to go over the class that you missed. **Please see me AT LUNCH if you have questions about a missed class or assignment.**
5. You will be responsible for bringing something to write with (preferably dark coloured pen) and paper to write on EVERY CLASS. If we are working on a novel or story, it is up to you to make sure that you have the book and whatever else you need in class.
